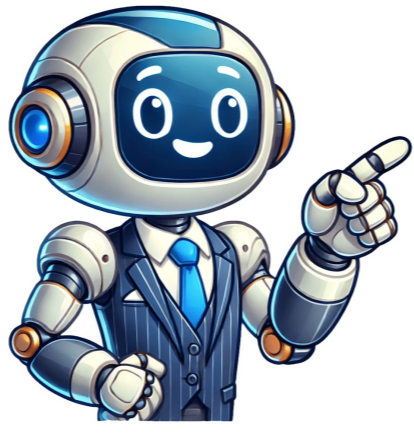

Table Of Content Learner's Permit and Driver's License Process, Requirements, and Restrictions You can get your learner's permit in Alabama at 15 years old. A 16-year-old with a license can only have one passenger (who isn't a family member) unless accompanied by a licensed driver at least 21 years old. Yes, if you are 18 or older, you can apply for a driver's license without holding a learner's permit first. However, if you're new to driving, it's advisable to practice driving before applying for the road test. A Class D license in Alabama is a standard, non-commercial driver's license that allows you to operate passenger vehicles and light trucks. A Class DV license in Alabama is a special license for disabled veterans. It grants standard driving privileges and may offer benefits related to veteran status. If you are under 18, keep your learner's permit for a minimum of six months before you're eligible for a driver's license. To get an Alabama driver's license, you must get a learner's permit and hold it for at least six months if you're under 18. Once that period is over, take and pass the roads skills test, pay the license fee and receive your driver's license. For an Alabama learner's permit, you must be at least 15 years old, pass a written knowledge test and a vision test at an ALEA office, provide the necessary documents, and pay the fee. Here's what you'll need to apply for your Alabama driver's license: Proof of identity: Birth certificate, U.S. passport, etc. Social Security number: Social Security card or other proof. Proof of residency: Utility bills, school enrollment documents, etc. Proof of lawful presence: If you're not a U.S. citizen, you need to provide legal documentation of your status. To get your permit, you'll need proof of identity, Social Security, and residency. No, if you are under 18, you must keep your permit for a minimum of six months before getting a license. If you are over 18, you can schedule and pass the road test on a separate day after getting your permit. It also features state-specific images like the Alabama state seal. Driver's License and Permit Fee and Renewal Cost A standard driver's license in Alabama costs \$36.25. The fee for a hardship license in Alabama is typically \$36.25, but additional fees may apply depending on your situation. The written test for a learner's permit costs \$5. The total cost for a learner's permit in Alabama is the same as the permit, \$36.25, including the test and issuance fee. The cost to renew your driver's license online in Alabama is \$36.25, with an additional convenience fee of approximately \$2.75. Arkansas Driver's License Renewal Process and Requirements Yes, you can renew your Alabama driver's license online through the Alabama Law Enforcement Agency (ALEA) website as long as you're eligible. You have a 60-day grace period after your license expires to renew it without penalty. However, you should avoid driving with an expired license during this time. To renew your license, you'll need your current driver's license, proof of identity, and Social Security number. Driver's License Expiry, Suspension, Replacement, and Reinstatement Alabama driver's licenses are valid for 4 years. You can renew your license up to 180 days (6 months) before it expires. Foreign or Out-of-State Driver's License To transfer your out-of-state driver's license to Alabama, visit an ALEA office with the required documents, pass a vision test, and pay the fee. No written or driving test is required if your out-of-state license is still valid. Commercial Driver's License (CDL) The Alabama CDL general knowledge permit test consists of 50 questions. You must answer at least 40 questions correctly to pass, which is a score of 80%. To get a CDL in Alabama, first, obtain a Commercial Learner's Permit by passing the CDL general knowledge test and any necessary endorsement exams. Hold your CLP for at least 14 days. Next, complete a certified CDL training program to prepare for the road skills test. Afterward, pass the CDL Skills Test. Finally, pay the CDL application fee, with extra fees for endorsements. No, you cannot take the motorcycle license test online. The written and skills tests must be taken in person at an ALEA (Alabama Law Enforcement Agency) location. The fee for a motorcycle license in Alabama is \$36.25. You must be at least 16 years old to get a motorcycle license in Alabama. Alabama Driving Records and License Points Points stay on your license in Alabama for 2 years from the date of the violation. Points will automatically be removed after 2 years. A passing grade on the examination is 70%, or fourteen out of twenty questions. In order to apply for your permit, the State of Alabama requires that you provide the following documents. 15 year old applications must present:When you submit your application for your permit, you have ninety days or three attempts to successfully complete the written test. If you fail the test within ninety days you are allowed to retake it two more times, though usually you have to wait one day between attempts and you may be charged a reexamination fee each time. If you fail the test three times or wait longer than ninety days to retake it, then the application will be closed and you'll have to repeat the process from the beginning.In general, obtaining a learner's permit is not a difficult process. Students who have studied the Alabama Driver's Handbook in its entirety rarely have any problem passing the test, and for extra assurance an excellent idea is take one or more of the free practice tests that are available online. All of the questions that appear on the learner's permit test are found in the Alabama Driver's Handbook, which is also available for free download from the Alabama DPS website. The answers to these questions are also found in the handbook, so reading this book cover to cover is your best bet to ensure you achieve a passing score. There are two categories of questions found on the test. The first essentially deals with the "rules of the road", and covers a wide range of information to include:The written examination can be taken at any of your local driver's license offices. The Alabama Department of Public Safety (DPS) is now in charge of issuing driver's licenses and a list of all DL offices statewide can be found on their website. Once you've found a suitable office, completed an application and paid your fees, the test will be administered electronically on the computer and the results will be processed immediately upon completion.
